We are excited to call our newsletter 'Tukohu Moriori' - *tukohu* is a Moriori word for *special mat*, which could be a metaphor for traditional practice as well as a foundation, and also the weaving together of different strands - plus it references *kohu* (mist). The maro pictured is housed at Te Papa and is made from harapepe (flax), it is over 5m long and 12cm wide!

Puna Ora Oceans Research Kaupapa with Te Moriori Imi Settlement Trust for Rekohu

Puna Ora is a kaupapa Māori research project that aims to explore ocean management and conservation efforts with an indigenous worldview at the forefront. Led by Ngāti Kuri and Māori kairangahau (researchers) in relationship WWF, the project is funded by Oceans 5 to undertake case studies across Aotearoa and internationally, including the islands of Rēkohu of the Moriori people. The case studies will involve undertaking interviews with key members of the island, Imi and conservation efforts. The premise of the research is that an indigenous-led approach has outcomes that are innovative, holistic (e.g. take into context the land and sea relationship), and are intergenerational in nature due to the cultural relationship with the ocean.

The research funding is targeted toward the following outcomes for Oceans 5:

- Development of a coalition that has cross-sector interest in the ocean to deepen the conservation and create ocean solutions that have tikanga/tikane-led approaches at its forefront.
- Develop case studies and research reports to provide an evidence base on tikanga/tikane-led approaches that inform ocean health and wellbeing.
- Develop international indigenous partnerships to create reciprocal knowledge-sharing to help amplify indigenous voices in ocean outcomes.
- Develop a framework that can inform ocean policy led by tikanga/tikane which would be based on research reports, delivered next pre-election cycle.

When: On 19 July 2025 Puna Ora will be joining the Moriori Imi Settlement Trust hui at Kopinga Marae (time to be confirmed) to introduce the kaupapa and research project in person. Interviews will be held over the week of 19-22 July.
